## (1) Specific Goals for the Course

This course aims to equip students with the skills to become increasingly independent learners. To develop individual learning pathways, students practice study skills such as time management, finding resources, and critical thinking. Students also practice strategies for learning new vocabulary and reflect on their individual learning styles. Weekly tasks include writing and speaking activities based on authentic scientific sources.
By the end of the course, students should be able to:

(ii) Use appropriate English vocabulary and grammar in applying academic study skills to modern scientific ideas. (Support Graduation Requirements Indicator 10-3)

- Employ proper source citation methods to avoid plagiarism.

- Produce an academic-style paper and presentation with a partner.
